#### Halloween already!

Halloween is fast approaching. This fun and harmless holiday may not be so fun and harmless for your pet.

Unpleasant as it is to think about, practitioners of black magic are known to steal black cats during this time as they are symbolic to them. If you own a black cat, we suggest you keep her indoors until after Halloween.

While the risk of your cat being stolen is extremely low, chocolate toxicity in your cat or dog is not. Chocolate can not only make your animal sick, it can be fatal. Semisweet and dark chocolates are the most dangerous forms.

Symptoms, which include nervousness, GI distress and excessive thirst, may not be seen for several hours. Affected pets may also have an irregular heartbeat which can be life threatening. If you suspect your animal has ingested chocolate, contact your veterinarian immediately.

This is a great opportunity to teach your children to not only keep the candy away from your animals, but not to feed them anything other than their own food. It will keep Fido and Whiskers safe, healthy, and slim

This is Hannah Kominiarek, a 7 year old black lab mix. She was seen by Dr. Gough in August for a swollen toe. The toe was also very sore as she was favoring her foot quite markedly. An X-ray showed noticeable deterioration of the last bone of the toe. The two primary concerns were infection and cancer. After only limited improvement on antibiotics Dr. Gough decided that to be on the safe side amputation of the digit was the best course of action. Hannah handled the surgery very well. The biopsy results showed that there was indeed squamous cell carcinoma in the bone and nail bed. In cases like this, early amputation of the digit is generally curative. Her owner reports that Hannah is definitely back to herself and doesn't report missing her toe a bit!
